TOP TEN

- 1 The accounting faculty was ranked second worldwide in publishing academic tax research over the past six years. They are ranked third over the past 12 years, and fourth over all years, according to ratings compiled by Brigham Young University.
- 2 Ryan Wilson received the Lundquist College of Business 2014
 Goulet Research Excellence Award. This is the sixth consecutive
 year, and the seventh time in the past eight years, that a member
 of the accounting faculty has been honored with this award.
- Accounting alumna **Tiffany Phillips** '13 was awarded the esteemed Elijah Watt Sells Award for 2013. This award is for people who earned a cumulative average score above 95.5 on the CPA exam, completed testing over the 2013 calendar year, and passed all four sections on their first attempt. This is the second year in a row that a UO accounting alum has earned this honor.
- Master of Accounting Program alum Yujie "Jack" Zhang '13, MActg '14, was one of only 97 students in the United States to win the AICPA Scholarship for Minority Accounting Students for 2013–14. The award recognizes academic achievement, leadership, and commitment to pursuing the CPA. Jack also was honored with the UO Centurion Award for his dedication and outstanding service as a student leader.
- 5 Tiffany Phillips '13, William Geller '12, and Eric Seifert '12, MActg '13, earned the three highest scores on the CPA exam in Oregon for 2013.
- The accounting department designed the innovative **3+1**Accounting Pathway for motivated students whose goal is to complete their 225 credits in four years.
- 7 Our Beta Alpha Psi chapter received "Superior Status" for the 11th consecutive year.
- **8 Ryan Wilson** had three papers published and one paper accepted by three of the top five academic accounting journals.

Established in 1997, the Accounting Circle consists of more than 140 business leaders who actively support excellence in accounting education at the University of Oregon. The circle is the accounting department's strongest link to the accounting and business communities. The organization serves a vital fundraising mission, providing the financial backing necessary for the department's continuous improvement of its faculty, curriculum, and student programs.

Each fall, the Accounting Circle meets with the accounting faculty for an update on department finances, to discuss issues in accounting education, and to explore ways to better prepare students to enter the profession. After our meeting, we all attend the annual Accounting Circle tailgate party and then cheer the Ducks on to another football victory.

Accounting Circle Associates

Four years ago, we established the Accounting Circle associates level for our supporters who are not quite ready to join the circle as a full member. Associate members contribute a minimum of \$750 annually while full circle members contribute a minimum of \$1,500 annually. The associates group has grown to 35 members and counting, and we look forward to continuing to expand membership at both the associates and full levels.

FACULTY FOCUS

Angela Davis ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR OF ACCOUNTING



Originally from Boise, Davis received her bachelor's degree in accounting from the University of Idaho (1993) and her PhD from the

University of Washington (2001). Prior to pursuing her PhD, Angie worked as an auditor for KPMG in Portland and as a corporate accountant for Albertson's in Boise.

Davis enjoys teaching at various levels. Last year, she taught Accounting Measurement and Disclosure to the master of accounting and MBA students. She says the work and educational experiences the master's students bring to the classroom make for dynamic and interesting discussions.

She especially likes bringing elements of her research to the curriculum and believes that exposing the students to academic research broadens their understanding of accounting and the role it plays in capital markets.

Davis also has fun teaching Intermediate Accounting I to the undergraduate accounting majors. She enjoys seeing them take the tools they learned from introductory accounting classes to step into a deeper examination of accounting issues, while watching the "light bulb effect" in action as her students' understanding of accounting matures.

Davis's research generally focuses on managers' voluntary disclosures. In a paper soon to be published in the *Review of Accounting Studies*, Davis and her coauthors investigate whether a manager's tendency to be optimistic or pessimistic affects the tone used in a firm's quarterly conference calls. They find that conference call tones reflect not only the current and future

performance of a firm, but also this manager-specific characteristic. Currently, Davis is working on a project related to corporate social responsibility and the payment of corporate taxes. She is also collaborating with UO PhD candidate (and Harvard Law School graduate) Joshua Cutler on a paper investigating securities litigation related to disclosure. Davis has also published research coauthored with her husband, UO economics associate professor Jeremy Piger. Although they are not working on any current projects, they may collaborate again in the future. She jokes, "It makes for interesting dinner conversation. Our kids just love listening to us discuss research ideas."

If she didn't sound busy enough, Davis is also the mother of two active boys, Henry, age 10, and Owen, age eight. They attend French immersion school in South Eugene and are involved in activities ranging from soccer to musical theater. Once the boys are fluent in French, Angie and her husband plan to take the family to France, so the boys can lead the family vacation *en Français*.

Bruce Darling INSTRUCTOR OF ACCOUNTING



You wouldn't know it from his low-key personality, but Bruce Darling has many stories to tell from his very interesting life.

He has hung out with the likes of Tom Petty, David Copperfield, and Pele. He has played softball with Bruce Springsteen, watched Meatloaf record the album *Bat Out of Hell*, and had the chance to play professional soccer. His hobbies include building model trains, competitive checkers, and sumo wrestling.

How does an accounting instructor and practitioner have such a varied history?

It all started after he graduated from college in Ohio, when he got his first accounting job doing bookkeeping for the Agora Theatre. The Agora was run by the LoConti family, most notably the late Henry LoConti, legendary for his contributions to the rock music industry. Henry's brother Nick was the house accountant, and took Darling under his wing. Darling recalls, "College gave me my degrees, but Nick gave me my education."

Working at the theater had its perks. Not only did Darling get great accounting experience, he also had access to great shows and cool introductions to up-and-coming musicians. Darling started his own accounting firm in 1980, with the Agora being one of his first clients.

Darling eventually went back to school and earned his MBA (1990) and master of accounting and financial information systems (1994) at Cleveland State University, where he got his first taste of teaching. He went on to become an accounting instructor at Lake Erie College, then moved on to Stark State College, where he served as head of the accounting and finance departments. He found himself moving to the Eugene area after visiting a friend in Oregon and meeting UO accounting professors Dale Morse and Ray King. In 2002, Bruce moved into a house up the river near McKenzie Bridge, where he enjoys the beauty and quiet of the Northwest.

There are many reasons Darling loves teaching. For one thing, he feels it keeps him young being around young minds. He also finds teaching invigorating and loves being able to make a difference in students' lives.

Darling continues to run his accounting firm more than 30 years later, a much smaller practice than it used to be. If you run into Bruce, be sure to ask him about his days at the Agora.

The accounting department operates an active PhD program designed to train students for a successful career in academia.



Krieg has a bachelor's degree in business administration from the University of California at Berkeley. Both students have several years' experience working in the tax department for public accounting firms and intend to focus their research on tax.

Jingjing Huang successfully defended her dissertation, "The Role of Taxes in Foreign Earnings Management: Implications for Pricing of Foreign Earnings." She accepted a position as an assistant professor of accounting at Virginia Tech University, where she will be teaching corporate taxation and continuing her research. Brian Williams, Shan Wang, Josh Cutler, Russell Li, Aaron Mandell, Becky Perez, Myron Chang, and Kaishu Wu are continuing their studies in the program. Both Williams and Cutler presented papers at the University of British Columbia, University of Oregon, and University of Washington (UBCOW) Conference in Seattle, Washington, and the American Accounting Association (AAA) Annual

Meeting in Anaheim, California. Perez is a recipient of the KPMG Foundation Scholarship and the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants Doctoral Minority Scholarship.

The doctoral program relies heavily on the financial support provided by the Accounting Circle and donors to the accounting program. This funding allows us to compete for the top candidates and provides additional research opportunities for our students. It also allows our students to focus on developing their research skills and generating a research portfolio that will enhance their placement opportunities.

We are always looking for strong candidates to join our program. Although doctoral programs and subsequent academic careers are demanding, they provide rewards (monetary and otherwise) that few careers can match. If you are someone who would appreciate the thrill of discovery, the feeling of accomplishment of seeing your work in print, and the satisfaction that goes with being a positive influence in the lives of your students, we hope that you will consider our program.
