# **Academic Advisors**

Advisors are available by in person, phone, or video conference appointments. Limited evening and weekend advising hours may be available with our remote advisor.

Advisors can provide information on applying to the major, academic planning, study abroad, clubs, professional organizations, and scholarships.

Students are urged to meet with a college of business advisor at least once a year. During week one and weeks seven through eleven, students need to plan in advance as demand increases at the start of the term and during registration periods. Drop-in advising and scheduled 30-minute appointments are available at different points in the term.

### **Peer Advisors**

Drop-in academic advising 203 Peterson. Monday through Friday, 10 a.m. – 4 p.m., except holidays & finals week. The peer advising office is staffed by a highly trained group of exceptional junior and senior business students who can assist with:

- Mapping out short and long-term academic plans
- Explaining pre-business, major and graduation requirements
- Assisting with calculating GPAs
- Providing a better understanding of the courses and the workload
- Answering questions about clubs and activities within the business school

Suggested Term Schedule for Successful Advising	
Before term	Identify your goals for the term. Goals may include student engagement, campus life, career, graduate and/or professional school
Week 1	If necessary, make any last-minute changes to your term schedule; check academic deadlines on the Registrar's web site for important dates related to adding and dropping. Review class syllabi and add important dates to your planner or calendar.
Weeks 2-5, & ongoing	Get to know your instructors and visit them during their office hours throughout the term to discuss assignments, papers, and exams. Consider making an advising appointment with major/minor department or attending drop-in advising with peers in preparation for next term registration.
Weeks 6-7	Review, discuss current and projected final course grade with instructor, and consider-deadlines to drop a class and/or change grade option (graded or P/NP). Prepare to register for next term. Look up your registration time on the Registrar's web site (your specific time will
	be available in DuckWeb by middle of week 7). Check DuckWeb for any holds you have and take action to clear them.
	Review your major, minor, and university requirements in Ducks on Track. Identify courses you need and would like to take using the class schedule and schedule planning tools when the schedule is released on Friday of week 5 ( <u>classes.uoregon.edu</u> ).
Weeks 8-9	Register for next term's courses on DuckWeb. Lundquist Academic Advisors are available vis drop-in advising.
Week 10	Complete any projects due at the end of the term. Verify final exam dates/times and begin review for final exams. Fill out course evaluations on DuckWeb.
