The <u>Division of Equity and Inclusion</u> provides a list of <u>Post-Election Resources</u> for <u>Students</u>.

International students and scholars can receive advice from UO <u>International</u> <u>Student and Scholar Services</u> (ISSS) in the Office of International Affairs. Some students may qualify for <u>emergency financial aid</u>. As a reminder, ISSS cannot provide legal advice, but can point one towards legal resources.
